

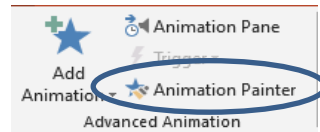
Application: PowerPoint – Animation Painter

Setting up animations on your objects in PowerPoint can be very time consuming especially if you change one and then have to change others. You can use the Animation Painter to copy the animation from one object to another.

Copying Animation to One Object

1. **Select** the **object** that has the animations that you want to copy.

2. **Click** on **Animations tab > Advanced Animation Group > Animation Painter.**



3. The cursor will now appear as a paintbrush

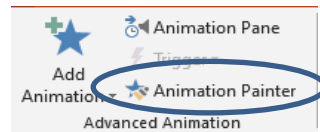


4. **Click** on the object you want to copy the animation to.

Copying Animation to More than one Object

1. **Select** the **object** that has the animations that you want to copy.

2. **Double-click** on **Select Animations tab > Advanced Animation Group > Animation Painter.**



3. The cursor will now appear as a paintbrush



4. **Click** on the first object you want to copy the animation to.

5. Repeat Step 4 until you have copied the animation to all the required objects.

Cancelling the Animation Painter

The Animation Painter will be cancelled when you perform another action or you can press **Escape**.
